One of our undergraduate students, Mr. Steven T. Casseday, passed away on July 20, 2011. He was a senior, Pre-Business major in the Belk College of Business. Steven planned to pursue a B.S.B.A. in Finance. He had earned 98 semester hours towards his degree and had a 2.377 GPA. I am requesting that the Belk College faculty recommend awarding him a posthumous degree.

The University policy states that “any student who at the time of his death was duly enrolled and had completed 90 semester hours towards a degree at UNC Charlotte shall, upon the recommendation of the faculty in his College, be awarded his degree posthumously.” (*April 17, 1975*)

Unanimously approved by the faculty on August 26, 2011.
